NOTABLE CASES

Springman v. Surrey (City), 2021 BCSC 1804, rev'd in part, 2023 BCCA

130. Evan Cooke and Andrew Schleichkorn successfully defended a
multi-million dollar expropriation compensation claim filed against the
expropriating municipality. Most significantly, the courts dismissed
claims of ongoing business losses and damages predicated on lost

real estate market opportunity.

Peters v. Bird, <u>2020 BCSC 130</u> (under appeal). Counsel in a complex liability-only motor vehicle accident trial where identity and liability issues were seriously contested.

Dube v. Dube, <u>2019 BCSC 687</u>. Counsel for the defendant disputing the plaintiff's damages claim arising from personal injury, and secured a fair result.

<u>Vapor Line Inc. v. Vcan Business Solutions Ltd.</u> (30 April 2018), Vancouver Registry No. S185233 (B.C.S.C.). Counsel for the petitioner on successful injunction application to restrict the respondent from evicting the petitioner from its commercial premises.

Banque Manuvie du Canada c. Guillemette, <u>2015 QCCS 1977</u>. Counsel for successful petitioner seeking forced surrender of property and acquired conduct of sale.
